A 3-Lesson Bible Study

GOD'S JUDGMENT ISN'T SOMETHING WE REALLY ENJOY THINKING about. It can make us squirm a little. But students will never truly understand God's love and grace until they understand His righteous justice.

God's Judgment, one of the studies in the **elements** line of Bible study curriculum, will help your students understand God's role as righteous judge, the judgment Christ took on their behalf (and the new life He purchased them), and what doing justice practically looks like in their context.

Teach **elements** | *God's Judgment* and equip your students with a fuller understanding of who God is and who He expects them to be.

God's Judgment Lesson Overviews

Lesson 1: Seeing God As The Judge

- **Objective:** The point of the lesson is that your students would see God as the righteous judge who seeks to set all things right, and be able to express what thoughts or emotions this truth evokes in them.
- **Scripture Focus:** Deuteronomy 32:1-4, Psalm 96:10-13, Psalm 9:7-11

Lesson 2: Death For Life

- **Objective:** The point of the lesson is that your students would understand how the judgment (that we deserved) leveled at Jesus on the cross purchased life for them, and what this truth means for their life on this earth and in eternity.
- **Scripture Focus:** Romans 6:23, Romans 3:21-26, John 10:10

Lesson 3: Justice Patrol

- **Objective:** The point of the lesson is that your students would understand that being justified by God means being agents of God's justice in this world, and that they would have the opportunity to flesh out what doing justice practically looks like in their contexts.
 - **Scripture Focus:** Matthew 23:23, Luke 3:7-14
