A 3-Lesson Bible Study

When students think worship, more than likely they think of music. While worshipping God through music is a powerful way to praise Him, this is by far not the only way to think about worship. This study will define worship for your students, but will then go deeper into how we worship God beyond singing praise music with friends at Church.

Worship, one of the studies in the **elements** line of Bible study curriculum, will help your students understand that worship is the right response that results from our encountering God; that seeing Jesus for who He is and responding to Him in worship is vital; and that responding to God looks a lot of different ways, each of them a vital way of interacting in relationship with Him.

Worship Lesson Overviews

Lesson 1: The Right Response

- **Lesson Objectives:** To understand that worship is the right response that results from our encountering God; to begin to be aware of where and how they are encountering God; and to be intentional about responding in worship once they encounter Him.
- **Scripture Focus:** Psalms 8:1-5, Psalms 63:1-5, Psalms 33:1-5, Colossians 3:15-17

Lesson 2: Responding To Jesus

- **Lesson Objectives:** To understand that seeing Jesus for who He is and responding to Him in worship may look different ways, but the important thing is that we respond; and to respond in worship to Christ in a way that shares the message of Christ.
- **Scripture Focus:** Luke 4:31-47, Luke 7:11-17, Matthew 14:22-33, Matthew 13:53-57

Lesson 3: Worship In Action

- **Lesson Objectives:** To understand that responding to God looks a lot of different ways, each of them a vital way of interacting in relationship with Him; and to identify one or more ways of worshipping God, committing to practicing them in the week(s) following your lesson.
 - **Scripture Focus:** Nehemiah 8:1-6, Psalms 103:1-5, Philippians 2:14-18, Psalms 51:1-15, Romans 12:1-2
